ROUTING HIGHLIGHTS:

Swakopmund - Etosha National Park – Windhoek

Etosha National Park, Private Lodge outside the Park, Lake Otjikoto + Okavandja

The Etosha National Park is a must for every visitor to Namibia. The dried out saltpan is the centre of the Etosha Park and the waterholes, both natural and man-made, attract thousands of animals. The scenery is unique and together with herds of antelope, zebra and big game such as elephant, rhino and lion give this beautiful game park its essential character.



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ITINERARY:

Day 1

Saturdays

Depart Swakopmund northbound. Continue (lunch stop, for own account - and possibly meet up with fellow travellers) into Etosha National Park, where we undertake the first game drive in our touring vehicle. Just before sunset we will leave Etosha again and drive to our lodge/safari camp outside the Park.

DBB – privately owned lodge near Etosha Park – preferably Etosha Safari Camp

Day 2

Sundays

A full day in the Park lies ahead of us. Except for the rainy season, Etosha's animals are depending on artificial waterholes and natural springs. Explore the various waterholes along this enormous saltpan, which is called the "great white place of dry water" in a local language. Lunch stop at one of the rest camps (lunch excluded - for your own account).

DBB – privately owned lodge near Etosha Park – preferably Etosha Safari Camp

Day 3

Mondays

Encounter the big variety of wildlife in the Park one more day. More than 114 mammals species are found in the Park, several of them are rare and endangered like the black rhino of the black faced impala. You have a great chance of seeing some of the bigger mammals, like elephant and rhino and of course a highlight in any safari, the predators. Lunch stop at one of the rest camps (lunch excluded - for your own account).

DBB - preferably Rest camp inside the Etosha National Park; alternatively privately owned lodge near the Park

Day 4

Tuesdays

Depart during the morning and travel southwards to Otjiwarongo and via Okahandja, where we will visit a local craft market, to Windhoek for arrival during the late afternoon.

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Included:

Tour in a small group (up to 15 participants) with English speaking driver / guide.

Accommodation and meals: 3x breakfast, 3x dinner. Game viewing as listed above, park-entrance-fees, portage, and still water on board the vehicle is free of charge.

Excluded:

Lunches, beverages, tips, personal insurances and other personal items are excluded.
